A Message from the President

he Field Club's summer officially ended with the Labor Day Tailgate on September 2. Social Committee Chair Chris Nicholson and her committee members did an outstanding job with the Tailgate and all of this year's social events. Next... on to platform tennis season! With the end of summer comes the close of The Field Club's fiscal year (September 30). We have closed our 2007 year in great shape; the Club is financially healthy, we have an active and participating membership, the Club's waiting list continues to be full, and we have a stable, excellent staff. Thanks and congratulations go out to Jim Girotti and his staff for ensuring the success of another Field Club year. One important aspect of the continued success of The Field Club is the need to stay on top of long-range capital planning for a facility that is over 40 years old. These long-range items include the maintenance and possible future upgrade of our tennis courts, expanding platform tennis, upgrading the paddle warm-up hut, the need for a second well to provide more water to the Club and increasing electrical capacity. Some long-range items have been addressed over the past several years, such as the addition of a fourth paddle court, new well pump and the rebuilding of the hard court and practice tennis areas. The Field Club will need to remain diligent about future long-term capital planning to ensure its continued success.

Please mark your calendars for the **Annual** Meeting to be held on Friday, November 2, at 6:30 p.m., at the Springfield Country Club. Last year, Field Club President **Mike Shields** proposed a new format for the Annual Meeting that was extremely successful. In an effort to increase attendance at the

event, the necessary business discussions were kept to a minimum and a social agenda was introduced, which included door prizes, hors d'oeuvres, a cash bar and time to catch up with friends. We will be continuing with this tradition again this year. Come help us kick off the new season.

At the annual meeting, I will be ending my threeyear term on the Board, and Vice President Lisa Doherty will become the new Field Club Board President. APTA at a Glance

The American Platform Tennis Association (APTA) is the governing body of the sport of Platform Tennis. The APTA's professional staff coordinates the efforts of APTA volunteers, players, tournament directors and Board members. They have knowledge of how to play the game, where to purchase paddles and balls, where to play and where to seek instruction. The APTA works to promote and develop the sport at all levels. It supports local, regional, and national participation and sanctions and promotes over 100 platform tennis tournaments a year, including juniors, men's, women's, and mixed doubles.

The APTA divides North America into six regions of play. Region II covers Connecticut (North of Fairfield County), New England and Upstate New York.
