A Message from the President

was recently cleaning out my Field Club file, spring cleaning that happens about every third year. My file had gotten pretty thick, as I am now serving my third year on the Board. As I sorted and organized, I was struck by a list of capital improvements. The annual budget for capital expenditures is \$70,000. Each year the Board determines which items have the greatest priority for our members. Some are big ticket items that are easily recognized, and some are the smaller details that keep the place in terrific shape.

So, I thought you might be interested in where the Board has spent its annual fund over the past few years. We have made our most significant investment in the tennis area, starting with the hard courts in 2006. Because of the \$80,000 price tag, that required a small assessment in addition to the annual spending. In addition, we did the practice court area, including fencing and landscaping, for a cost of approximately \$32,000. Both of those areas were dangerous and under utilized, so the upgrade was a real necessity. The tennis building saw some overhaul, with the repair of a leaking roof, the replacement of the lounge rug, and new deck chairs for a cost of \$4,500. And, in the unglamorousbut-much-needed category, we repainted the lighting poles at a cost of \$10,000. We continue to invest in the awnings to provide shade between courts, spending nearly \$20,000, with more to come.

At the swimming pool, we did some repair and repainting in the 2006 season for \$14,500. We also added the gate to comply with new town regulations, price tag \$500. We have been refurbishing the pool lounge chairs, spending roughly \$3,000 to date. On the paddle courts, after the investment of a new court a few years ago, our commitments have been smaller. We have planted two sets of arbor vitae to help with the wind, a \$7,500 expense. In the Snuggery, we have invested about \$6,000 in equipment upgrades such as a new cooler.

After 40 years, we were concerned that the pump in the well might give out, so that was replaced last year for \$7,000. We added some lighting in the parking lot for \$4,000. We also added a new AED machine (the cardiac equipment) to allow us to have one at the pool and tennis courts. The new equipment, which cost \$2,000, can be utilized on children, an important enhancement. Also in the unglamorous category, we replaced the pressure tanks for the sprinkler system at a cost of \$8,300. New tractors set us back \$2,500.

For 2008, our biggest capital expenditure will be the additional lighting for courts 9 and 10. The project is well underway, and we hope to have them in service soon. It should help alleviate some of our capacity challenges at night. Total cost: \$40,000.

I am sure I missed a few along the way, but the point is, we continue to invest in the Club for the needs of its members, both to add services (new lights, new backboard, etc.) and for necessities. We try to be frugal with our money, to maximize our investment. And, as always, here is an open invitation to share your opinion about where your dollars are being spent. Contact myself or any board member; we are happy to have your opinion. Enjoy the Club... I look forward to seeing you out there this season.



Snuggery News

As reported in previous editions of *The Baseline*, the Snuggery, under our own management, has been operating profitably, and that's very good news. Now, we are able to afford to replace failing equipment without having to go pleading to the Board for approval of such things. The result was last summer's purchase of a new frozen ice machine (like for frozen lemonade), which proved to be quite popular. We are continuing with our \$25 family minimum for the summer, so be sure to use the Snuggery to avoid that charge at the end of the summer. You may wish to take advantage of the following:

SUNDAY BRUNCH: On Sunday, July 20, from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m., the Snuggery will be serving Sunday Brunch. Bring the family and enjoy the full array of "off the menu" items we'll be serving that day. This is a first-time event, so we'll be eager to see if you like it.

COLD SALAD PLATE: This delicious new menu item includes tuna salad, egg salad and cottage cheese.

ORDER IN ADVANCE: Want to have your lunch ready for you when you arrive? Drop by the Snuggery today after tennis and put in your order for tomorrow's lunch. Simply fill out your order from the menu, tell Eileen when you want it to be ready, and then... BE SURE to show up (as you'll be billed for your meal). Or, alternatively, go to Eileen in advance of your match and request that your meal be ready when you're through. Your whole group can enjoy lunch together, and it will be helpful to the staff to have your order in advance.

Board Corner

April 10, 2008, Board Meeting

Tennis: Treasurer Bill Monks: In reference to Vice President Doug Jangraw's letter, we need to make a decision on tennis court lighting. Doug submitted a thorough report on the tennis court renovation/maintenance situation entitled, "Notes from a Discussion with Tim Reid – 3/26/08."

Discussion ensued. The question: Should we light tennis courts 13 and 14, which are closer to the road and drain better, or should we light tennis courts 9 and 10, which are closer to the other courts currently lit? Western Mass Electric (the power supplier from the street) and Larry Eagan, a Club member with Collins Electric, our lighting consultant and contractor, can light either set of courts. Candy Weiner spoke out in favor of lighting courts 9 and 10. She thought the proximity to the other courts was important. Dave

Appleman spoke out in favor of lighting courts 13 and 14. Dave mentioned that courts 13 and 14 drain the best, are better courts, and that it would be easier to run an electric line from the street. A vote was taken (6-3) in favor of lighting courts 9 and 10, as originally planned.

Membership: Membership Chairperson Craig Carr moved (seconded by Candy Weiner) that the six couples that came to tonight's Meet & Greet be moved from the Regular Wait List to the Voted-In Wait List. Unanimously approved. The candidates and their sponsors are:

Bill Monks: A number of organizations that I deal with are abandoning U.S. Mail in communicating with their membership because of cost. Bill: We should train our membership to do the same. We should announce the change to online information versus mailed information at the Annual Meeting, and this should be the transition year; we should implement it by January '09. May 13, 2008, Board Meeting

Manager's Report

Jim Girotti reported: Tim Reid will be working on courts 5 through 8 tomorrow, to get them ready for the tennis season. The first four courts are super soft, and signs are up telling people it's pre-season. Some of the players are digging in and are not sweeping at night. Six Har-Tru and two hard courts are currently ready to play. Ann Boisvert is already teaching tennis. The proshop is open on the weekend. The tennis deck has been touched up and painted in areas. The Snuggery operating applications are in. We had a meeting at Stew Creelman's house in regard to the Snuggery. In regard to the swimming pool, the pool is ready to be filled. Mother Nature has been against me, but we will start filling the pool tomorrow. It will take three straight days to fill it. The chlorine is in. We will meet with pool staff on Sunday to clean. We have purchased six new stop watches, a new life line and lap lines. Our power washer died. We purchased a new tractor from Home Depot for \$299. The town selectman rejected Western Mass Electric's proposal for a new electric pole for The Field Club because they said that it would take away a parking space. Western Mass Electric assures us that we will have plenty of juice from the existing pole. There will be a meter on the pole. President Lisa Doherty: What is the estimated time to completion? Jim: three weeks. The tennis practice area needs to be painted. In regard to platform tennis, two companies have submitted bids for annual maintenance. We have been working in the Snuggery, and we have been trying to get the pool up and running. The water system is being replaced for the hard courts. Two out of 16 awnings are in. It was supposed to be done before Memorial Day. Sun shades are being installed on the pool deck. Reid Tennis wants to postpone the installation of courts 9 and 10 until after Memorial Day, which I have agreed to. The wind screens are up.

Platform Tennis

Dave Appleman reported: We have two different estimates for maintenance. Members are still playing. We are not paying for the satellite dish. There is a big pile of Lost & Found items. Jim: Ronnie Leavitt takes many of the items to the islands. Dave: We need to replace five or six arbor vitae that got winter damage. The extension of the decking was positive. The lattice work underneath probably could wrap around. We need to decide on an annual maintenance contract

from one of the two companies. Some of the paddle screens are on their last legs. Bill Monks suggested that we could make the replacement of screens a capital expense. We will be painting the courts a new color, U.S. Open colors, and possibly test the new colors on court 4.

Social

Chris Nicholson reported: 120 to 130 are signed up for the Spring Fling at 7 p.m. at LCC. We need a ticket booth for drinks. For the Davis Cup party, Pam Low and Pam Stewart, one from the Social and one from the Tennis Committees, will be overseeing it.

Membership

Membership Chairperson Craig Carr reported: There are now 36 couples on the waiting list, which is healthy for the Club, a 2 ½ to 3-year wait for candidates. From Craig's report: ten couples are on the Voted-In Wait List, five applications have been received, and two applications have been released for membership.

Communications

Dick Forrest reported: Kim Conant, Renee's daughter, is creating the Monthly Calendar, combining June and July for the June *Baseline*, and will create the August Monthly Calendar to be mailed with the August *Baseline*. The deadline for the June *Baseline* is this coming Friday. A photo of the Men's A paddle champions and the tennis schedule will be included in the *Baseline*. Bill Monks brought up the issue about having an electronic version of the *Baseline* to save on printing and mailing costs. There was a discussion about having an online survey through Constant Contact in September to poll members on the feasibility of going to an electronic version of *The Baseline*. Dick will investigate the survey through Constant Contact for the Club.
