
our intent that renovations of two courts will be an annual budget item as part of our overall maintenance and upkeep of our facility.

Nationally-Ranking APTA Tournament a Success

On December 14, the Field Club played host to its first ever nationally-ranking APTA platform tennis event. Aided by a small army of assistants, and using courts at three other area clubs, Tournament Director Jeff Morneau seamlessly orchestrated the first-of-its-kind event, a worthy successor to the long-running President's Cup Qualifier, which has been held at the Club since 1991. The several inches of snow which began to fall early in the day failed to deter the sixty combatants who competed for the championships. "We felt the conditions presented an excellent opportunity to test the capacity of the court heaters," quipped Morneau. "Sadly the units on courts 1, 3 and 4 came up a little short later on, which caused a delay in play, the major consequence of which was to test the limits of the beer supply."

Morneau lauded the contributions of **Brad Hoffman, Mike Shields** and hut captain **Asa Nilsson** for the tournament's efficient operation.

"Asa was indispensable in keeping the matches moving all day, Brad took charge of overseeing the beverage responsibilities, and Shieldzy, when not playing his matches, spent most of the day in his remote videographer's perch. He may win an Emmy in the fog-shrouded video category."

Indeed, the three-set final won by top-seeded **Johan Du Randt** and partner **Mark Parsons** was contested in conditions of dubious visibility due to the accumulating snow and cold. "Jeff runs a great event, and I always enjoy playing in Longmeadow," a breathless Du Randt recounted after the win. "All four of us were impressed with the number of players and fans who stayed to see the finish. I hope they could see better than we could."

Nine of the thirty teams competing had at least one player from the Field Club, so despite the quality of the players (Du Randt and Parsons are the reigning National Champions) the tournament had a true local feel. **Jeff Morneau**, who with his partner **Todd Hiscox** dropped a very close semi final to the eventual winners, made the deepest penetration in the draw. The other star of the day was the Field Club's new platform hut. It

provided both excellent viewing opportunities, as well as a commodious area for staying warm for a large number of viewers.

Du Randt, the racquets professional at the Weston Golf Club and a former international tennis player originally from South Africa, had also been the featured teacher in a clinic on the night before the tournament for Club members. "Johan has established real credibility from his success at the national level and is a great teacher," said Morneau, "so he is a natural for this clinic, which has been popular with the members."
