### A Message from the President

We also ask the Select Board not to consider this site for a future DPW or other commercial or town development."

Please attend the **May 3** town meeting and vote "yes" to the citizen petition on the warrant to stop the DPW from building on the Wolf Swamp fields.

## 2016 Platform Tennis Club Championships


The Field Club Paddle Championships were a success, with 16 teams participating in the Men's, and four teams participating in the women's. The weather was just perfect!

# Ladies Paddle "B" Team Takes the Trophy




